The undersigned citizens and residents of that portion of Mason County hereinafter described, respectfully petition that upon a hearing had in the manner provided by law, you call a special election to create a port district comprising and including the following land:

All of Sections 31 and 32 in Township 22 North, Range 1 West,
All of Sections 27, 28, 29, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, in Township 22 North of Range 2 West,
All of Sections 5, 6, 7, 8 and that portion of Section 18 lying North of Pickering Passage in Township 21 North of Range 1 West,
All of Sections 1 to 23 inclusive and that portion of Section 24 lying North of Pickering Passage in Township 21 North of Range 2 West,
Also all tide or oyster lands abutting upon or included within any of the sections or parts of sections above described.

The name of said proposed district shall be Port of Grapeview and shall be divided into three commissioners districts having approximately equal population and boundaries described as follows:

Commissioners District No. 1: All of Sections 31 and 32 in Township 22 North, Range 1 West; All of Sections 27, 28, 29, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36 in Section 22 North of Range 2 West; All of Section 5 in Township 21 North of Range 1 West; All tide or oyster lands abutting upon or included within any of said sections.

Commissioners District No. 2: All of Section 6, the North half of Section 7, and all of Section 8 in Township 21 North of Range 1 West; All of Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11 and 12 in Township 21 North of Range 2 West; All tide or oyster lands abutting upon or included within any of said sections or parts of sections.

Commissioners District No. 3: The South half of Section 7 and that portion of Section 18 lying North of Pickering Passage in Township 21 North of Range 1 West; All of Sections 9, 10, 13 to 23 inclusive and that portion of Section 24 lying North of Pickering Passage in Section 21 North of Range 2 West.

We hereby respectfully nominate as commissioners of said port to be elected at the special election called to form the same the following:- As commissioner of District No. 1 above described, J. R. Johnson. As commissioner of District No. 2 above described, Edgar J. Wright. And as commissioner of District No. 3 above described, J.J.L. Rauschert.

The exterior boundaries of the land above described as being included in the proposed port and within which the undersigned reside is as follows: Beginning on the shore of Puget Sound where the same is intersected by the line dividing Sections 29 and 32 in Township 22 North of Range 1 West thence running West to the Southeast corner of Section 27 in Township 22 North of Range 2 West thence North to the Northeast corner of said Section 27 thence West to the Northwest corner of Section 29 in said township and range thence South to the Southwest corner of said Section 29 thence West

to the Northwest corner of Section 31 in said township and range thence South to the Southwest corner of Section 19 in Township 21 North of Range 2 West thence East to the shore of Puget Sound thence Northeasterly along the shore of Puget Sound to place of beginning including Beach and Stretch Islands and all tide and oyster lands abutting upon said shore.

It appearing that there has been filed with the Board, a petition praying for the formation of the Port of Grapeview, and it further appearing from the certificate of the County Auditor that said petition is signed by more than ten per cent of the electors residing within the proposed boundaries of such proposed district based on the total vote at the last general election within such area, and it further appearing that heretofore the Board set this day as the day for hearing such petition and that notice of such hearing has been published for two weeks in the Mason County Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in Mason County, and it further appearing that said proposed port district comprises only a portion of Mason County and has a population of less than fifteen hundred and that the petition for the formation of said port district describes three port commissioner districts numbered consecutively, having approximately equal population, area and boundaries, and that the said petition also nominates for commissioners of said port J. B. Johnson, Edgar J. Wright, and J. J. L. Rauschert, and it further appearing that said petition asks that a special election be called.

Be it therefore Resolved that an election be had at the Grapeview schoolhouse in Grapeview precinct Mason County Washington on the 27th day of October, 1923, between the hours of one and eight P. 
EXCERPT OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF COMMISSIONERS
